

HorseChannel's Online Bit Guide: Weymouth

Weymouth: The weymouth is an English leverage bit. It is the curb bit component of the double bridle used in saddle seat riding and on upper level dressage horses. The Weymouth looks similar to a pelham, but it features only one bit ring (at the bottom of the shank) and therefore operates with only one rein. It's available in several mouthpiece configurations, particularly various ports. When part of a double bridle, the Weymouth is adjusted slightly lower in the horse's mouth than the separate bradoon or snaffle component.
