Lay-up and rehabilitation services are also provided to help injured horses successfully return to racing. Specializing in breeding, Tommy Town has a 35-stall foaling barn. The ranch also has several barns, more than 130 stalls, an Equi-Ciser and a seven furlong track.

It's this type of beginning that starts the journey, and sometimes maintains that journey, for Thoroughbred racing. Tours of Tommy Town Thoroughbreds offer a chance for visitors to get a close-p look at this process. From real starting gates and young horses in training to stallion presentations and a walk through the mare barn, guests can experience Thoroughbred interaction on a new level.
